**AUTHORIZING THE VILLAGE MANAGER TO ACT AS A FISCAL AGENT FOR A  
GRANT RECEIVED FROM THE STATE HOMELAND SECURITY PROGRAM**

**WHEREAS**, a grant opportunity has become available through the State of Ohio Homeland Security Program that would, if received, fund the purchase of barricades and a trailer in which to transport said barricades; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Village of Yellow Springs regularly makes use of barricades as safety devices for all public gatherings, marches and parades, road closures and right-of-way work and at present the Police Department and Public Works Department must share the limited supply of these safety items,

**WHEREAS**, both the Public Works and Police Departments for the Village of Yellow Springs have expressed enthusiastic support for application to this grant,

**NOW, THEREFORE, COUNCIL FOR THE VILLAGE OF YELLOW SPRINGS, OHIO  
HEREBY RESOLVES THAT:**

**Section 1.** That upon receipt of this grant, the Village Manager is hereby authorized and directed to act as the fiscal agent responsible for authorizing purchase of the items named in the grant application here attached as Exhibit A, and is further authorized to accept 100% reimbursement for those items up to and including the amount authorized by the State Homeland Security Program.

Portable barriers will help to prevent terrorism and active aggressor events from occurring at planned public events such as fairs, community festivals, planned protests, and other public events that have large crowds. Any of these potential community events could become targets for terrorist attacks. Portable barriers will help to prevent terrorist attacks such as vehicle rammings at public events that have large crowds.

Included in this project are portable barriers and trailer(s) to support the barriers. The trailers would be used to transport the barriers to requesting jurisdictions across the county at different public events such as fairs, community festivals, planned protests, etc. The portable barriers would serve as a protective measure against acts of terrorism such as vehicle ramming at community events with large crowds across the county. The vehicle barriers must be able to be rapidly deployed & set up, able to withstand extreme environments. The vehicle barriers must be able to be deployed, positioned, and retrieved by one person without the need for heavy equipment. Each vehicle barrier must be between 50 lbs and 100 lbs per unit. Each vehicle barrier must be able to be lifted into a truck by one person without special equipment. The vehicle barriers must have the ability to function on various surface types including gravel, rock, sand, asphalt, and brick. The vehicle barriers must be compatible with each other. The vehicle barriers must lock in place, upon impact, to stop a vehicle from progressing further. The vehicle barriers must be able to stop vehicles weighing at least 5 tons, moving at various speeds between 5 mph up to 120 mph. The vehicle barriers must have the ability to link several barriers together for fixed position as well as the option to move the barriers out of the way quickly for an emergency response.

Yellow Springs Police Department will purchase the equipment and be responsible for the maintenance and oversight of the equipment.

The portable barriers will be able to be transported to requesting jurisdictions to a multitude of counties and homeland security region 3 through the use of equipment trailers that would also be purchased with this project. The vehicle barriers should have the ability to be set up without the need to modify the location, roadway, or any fixed structure.
