CALL TO ORDER

President of Council Brian Housh called the meeting to order at 8:00 am.

ROLL CALL

Present were President Housh, Vice President Marianne MacQueen and Council members Kevin Stokes, Lisa Kreeger and Laura Curliss (joined at 8:09am). Also present were Village Manager Josue Salmeron; Public Works Director Johnnie Burns, Planning and Zoning Administrator Denise Swinger, Public Works Director Johnnie Burns and Police Chief Carlson.

Topics were addressed as follows:

Check-In. All participants provided a general check-in statement and stated their hoped-for outcomes for the goals process.

Discussion of In-Person Meeting Options. Salmeron confirmed that the Village has the capacity to provide a space where citizens desiring an "in-person" experience can come to a room in the Bryan Center where they can view the meeting and make comment in front of a camera, if so desired. Face coverings, distancing and other best safety practices will be required. This is not currently in place, and several Council members asked that this be put in place soon.

Village Team Update and Pending Projects. Salmeron noted five core projects as primary goals for the Village team: Broadband; Water Infrastructure Improvements; Village Solar Projects; Safe Routes to Schools, Active Transportation Plan projects and Sanitary Sewer Improvements.

These were discussed in terms of intersection with Council goals, particularly environmental, housing and economic goals.

Council Goals Discussion. Council and the team worked through the draft goals document one section at a time. The Village relationship with Home, Inc., and the electric utility were particularly discussed.

There was some disagreement regarding whether or not the Village should develop a formal relationship with Home, Inc., and this matter will be brought to Council for further discussion and a draft proposal.

Dillon presented regarding the goal of a "structurally" balanced budget, and the strategies he sees as effective in this goal.

Chief Carlson presented his 2021 goals, including the formation of a "Care Team" to respond to persons in crisis, and the "de-militarization" of uniforms for a more approachable look.

Council ended the session before having covered the final five goal areas.

Board and Commission Strategies: This topic was held for later, due to time constraints.

At 11:02am, MacQueen MOVED and Curliss SECONDED a MOTION TO ADJOURN. The MOTION PASSED 5-0 ON A VOICE VOTE.
